- It's the season of giving but creating a budget or spending plan is key.
- Don't forget about non-gift related expense!

- Create a unique savings account for gift giving.

Avoiding Holiday Debt

- Avoid spending money you don't have.
- Credit cards can be risky.
- Average holiday debt: \$1,325
 - 75% said they wouldn't be able to pay off the debt in January.
 - 15% said they intend to only pay the minimum monthly payment.



Credit Card Tips



- Think of your credit card transactions as "mini-loans".
- Aim for using 10% of your credit limit.
- Track your balances.
- Understand the fees and perks associated with your card.

Credit Card Tips

- Pay your balance on time.
- Keep credit utilization low.
- Don't open multiple accounts at the same time.
- Keep accounts open.
- Review your credit report.
